A couple weeks back, I walked into a conversation that was impactful, to say the least. I had just enjoyed Central's version of a good old fashioned Hee Haw (it was excellent . . . and fun!), and sat down with my daughter, Miya, to enjoy a meal, courtesy of Young at Heart. We were seated at a table with some members of the group, to enjoy quality conversation before and during our lunch (We even got to choose the topic of discussion). So, I asked the ladies at the table to sound off on one of my daughters' favorite topics: stories of "when you were younger." In this case, because Miya is 10-years-old, I asked the ladies if they wouldn't mind sharing a story or two from when they were around the same age. I won't soon forget the opening lines: *"When I was 10 there was a Depression on. We didn't have a radio or a T.V. For Christmas, we didn't get more than a pencil . . . or a candy bar, if we were lucky."* I knew from that moment that Miya was in for an educational experience. An hour came and went and . . . I wasn't disappointed. What followed was a lively discussion of experiences well lived, years well filled, and of memories close at hand. We hit topics ranging from the Great Depression to American development to being a part of the WWII war effort.

It was that last topic that came and that comes to mind as I anticipate where we are heading this Christmas season. We're planning our Christmas sermon series around themes we lifted from the movie "It's a Wonderful Life." We're borrowing them for a reason. If you look at the movie itself, you notice it's one of those that is tied so tightly to Christmas that it's become a tradition in its own right. It ranks in the top ten of any list of the greatest movies of all time. Yet, at the time of its release, in the shadow of WWII (1946), it garnered very little initial fanfare. The passing years have, however, seen its popularity grow. I personally believe that it has risen to its present heights due to its insight into the human condition. It speaks quite eloquently to the dreams and struggles, the aspirations and difficulties, the joys and losses of those found living on both sides of "the war."

This Christmas season, we're going to zoom in on those insights. And as we do, I think you'll find that your eyes lift quite easily from that screen to another story, a story lived out because of the human condition "It's a Wonderful Life" illuminates so well. You know the one. It's the story of a manger and a Messiah, of God-with-us, Immanuel, the Son of God, come to guide us to the wonderful life God has for us. I hope you're ready for it. I can't wait.

Be bold. Stay faithful. Get stoked.

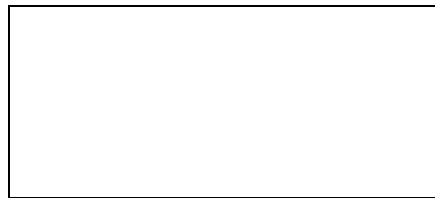
