Statistics can be revealing. Even though they're just numbers, they point to a reality beyond themselves. I got that feeling this past week from reading the results of the U.S. Department of Labor's *American Time Use Survey—2014* and Statista's *Average Daily Media Use in the United States*. They tell how Americans spent their time in 2014. The results are noteworthy. Each day on average Americans devote 8 hrs to <u>sleeping</u>, 7 hrs to <u>working</u>, 4 hrs/12 min to their <u>TV</u>, 2 hrs/24 min to <u>online pursuits</u>, 2 hrs/1 min to their <u>phone</u>, 15 min to <u>sports/recreation</u>, and 8 min to <u>religious and spiritual activities</u>. Taken together, these statistics paint a startling picture of media dependency, physical inactivity, and spiritual passivity. While these are all serious, it's the latter one that gets to me the most. I'll leave it to a New York City monument to tell you why.

When the Brooklyn Bridge was being built in the 1870s, there was controversy surrounding a perceived lack of progress in the construction of one of the two towers on which the bridge rests. At the same time the Brooklyn tower had risen 100 feet above the water line, the Manhattan tower was still 78 feet below the river, where no one could see it. For many, this progress failure was a testament to poor management and haphazard execution. However, this controversy was quelled in 1872, when the project's chief engineer wrote: *"To such of the general public as might imagine that no work had been done on the New York tower, because they see no evidence of it above the water, I should simply remark that the amount of the masonry and concrete laid on that foundation during the past winter, under water, is equal in quantity to the entire masonry of the Brooklyn tower visible today above the water-line" (McCullough, The Great Bridge, 289). In the near 150 years after its construction, the genius behind this decision to invest a significant amount of time building below the waterline has been proven time and again. The Brooklyn Bridge has stood while other bridges of its era have crumbled.*

What is true of the Brooklyn Bridge is true for our lives as well. If we invest our time only, or even primarily, in what is seen (read: above the waterline), we will fail to build a life that endures. As MacDonald states, *"Leaders blessed with great natural skills and charisma may be vulnerable to collapse in their character, their key relationships, and their center of belief because they never learned that one cannot (or should not) build above the waterline until there is a substantial foundation below it"* (MacDonald, *Below the Waterline*, 2). Perhaps this is why I'm so excited about the year-two emphasis of the Next Step Project (our two-year strategic plan): Advancing in faith and faithfulness. Because, it serves as a means by which we remind each other to walk a different path, to build richer and deeper lives through prayer and interaction with God, and then to build active and fruitful lives through intentional conversation and sharing our faith. Prayer and devotion followed by mission and God's work. And somewhere along the way, the reminder that our heart work must precede our hard work, and that our hard work flows out of our heart work.

May the upcoming weeks and months find you strategically investing your time in this way. Because you have a choice, build to last.

Be bold. Stay faithful.


