FAMILY FUN WALK TO BENEFIT LOCAL CHILDREN

The Central Women's Ministry Team is excited to announce their next event! Saturday, June 25, 2016 is the date set for the Family Fun Children's Outreach Walk to be held at Streator City Park from 9:00-11:00 a.m. This walk is planned with families in mind and all proceeds will benefit Guardian Angel Outreach, a local ministry.

A \$25 donation will register your family and one t-shirt is included. Additional t-shirts for your walking group may be purchased for an additional \$7 each.

If you cannot attend the walk, we are accepting donations of baby supplies to bless local mothers and families. Donations will be accepted at the Children's Outreach Walk table in the foyer beginning May 8 and continuing each Sunday until the Walk. Babies need many things that we will collect: diapers, wipes, lotion, bottles, teething rings, onesies, blankets, spoons, bowls, new or gently used clothing, et cetera. A complete list will be available at the Registration Table.



Guardian Angel Outreach is a local faith-based ministry assisting at-risk mothers and their infants from conception through the first two years of baby's life. Guardian Angel has an open-door policy to assist all women facing new-life issues in the City of Streator and surrounding communities. Individuals needing their assistance will find a safe and caring environment for education and support from volunteers and a Registered Nurse. Services offered include pre- and postnatal education, parenting classes, and ongoing assistance and guidance.

Come join us for a fun family morning of walking laps around the City Park! There will be prizes awarded for most laps walked by a child, most laps walked by an adult, creative outfits, family spirit, and more! You and your families can play games like ring toss, duck pond, marshmallow toss, bags, washers, and more! Snacks will be available.

Fellow Co-workers,

There was this quote I was toying with as I thought about the path we're going to chart during the summer. It's one of those Ralph Waldo Emerson gems: "To be great is to be misunderstood" (in "Self Reliance"). It came to mind, because, if being misunderstood is the test of greatness, then we've perhaps known a few great people, and we follow the greatest of them all: Jesus. Twenty years ago *Time*, *Newsweek*, and *US News and World Report* gave us a feel for that application. In 1996, they all featured the same cover story: Jesus Christ. But, the problem is, if you turn past the front cover of these magazines, you're treated to confusion rather than clarity, articles that move more toward personal reflection than historical evidence. If these articles are the test, 2000+ years have passed since Jesus walked the dusty roads of Palestine, and yet misconceptions abound concerning his person and his mission. The past 20 years haven't changed things either. If the test of greatness is being misunderstood, then Jesus is great indeed!

So, who is Jesus, *really*? I like how Mark Moore gets us started:

"You know he's no politician, but he still transforms nations. He's no social activist, but he is the genesis of who knows how many hospitals, orphanages, and innumerable acts of kindness. He's certainly not a pop-celebrity, but whose calendar is more crowded? A psychotherapist? Hardly. But how many of us 'Humpty Dumpties' has he put back together again?! This peasant carpenter has built himself a kingdom immeasurably greater than his earthly enemies could have imagined" (Life of Christ).

In a word, Jesus was "remarkable," he was "unparalleled." But, who is he? "He's the Lord of my life, the Savior of my soul," we say, and that certainly gets us started. "He is the Messiah of Israel and Lord of the Church," we read. "He's the one who died for our sins and rose for our justification," we hear, and it moves us closer still. But who was he, *really*, and why does it matter?

This summer, we're going to take that question to town just a bit. And we're going to let John, a man who had a ringside seat to Jesus' life, help us find the right picture that leads to the right conclusion in the matter. The stated goal of John's Gospel is to guide us to belief in Jesus (a response to who he truly is), a belief that leads us to "life in His name" (John 20:31). To that end, John records acts accomplished, miracles done and claims made by Jesus, things that help us in the search for clarity about him. It's helpful insight. And, this summer, we're going to find it to be useful insight too. This summer we're kicking off a journey to the picture John gives in a series that were calling "Instagramming the Impossible." And, we're together going to find a picture of Jesus . . . beyond misconception.

So, who was Jesus, *really*? You tell me.

Be bold. Stay faithful.

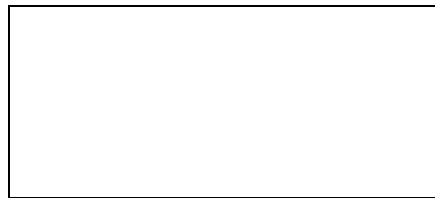
