Fellow Co-workers,

very now and then something is introduced into your life in such a way that it alters your perspective. One such visual hit me years ago, during a seminary lecture on church life-cycles. In that lecture Dr. Estep introduced me to research conducted by Robert Dale, research that made use of a Sigmoid Curve, the visual of note ("Sigmoid" just means "C or S-shaped"). According to Dale, every congregation has a health cycle that involves nine stages leading from health through decline: dream, beliefs, goals, structure, ministry, nostalgia, questioning, polarization, and dropout. To show how congregations move through these stages, he graphs the stages on a Sigmoid Curve. A good summary is as follows:

Imagine a bell curve, with dreams on the bottom left, a curve that moves upward as clarifying beliefs, strategic goals, and facilitating structure are added to help a church reach a peak in ministry effectiveness. However, the peak does not last forever, and decline sets in as churches begin to celebrate accomplishments or fall into a kind of preservation mode to lock in their successes. Soon, the congregation starts to recognize that "there was a time when" they were more effective than they are at present (i.e. they start becoming nostalgic). In this stage, there is still enough momentum from the past to sustain a semblance of current effectiveness. But this is simply the lull before the storm. The seeds of decline have already been sown, and if left unchecked, the congregation will continue the downward slope of the curve into questioning, polarization, dropout, and perhaps even to organizational death (Carlus Gupton, *Dale, To Dream Again*).

As helpful as Dale's Sigmoid Curve has been over the years, for clarifying what I've seen in churches, it's the hopeful piece of his research that really motivates me. According to Dale, even though congregations move through these predictable life stages, decline doesn't have to be the end of the story. When decline sets in, if a church starts to dream, and develop and execute new plans to accomplish those dreams, then the church starts another Sigmoid Curve, a new cycle of health, and begins to grow again.


Maybe it's this way of looking at the church that gets me excited about the work of the past few weeks. As you all know, this past May 20-21 we had a Vision Retreat to mark out our church vision, clarify our target audience, and put together our 2016-2018 strategic plan. As hopeful as the process was and is (given what we know from Dale), it's the helpfulness that I'm most excited about. Even though I found that the retreat goals were a bit ambitious (my fault), the vision we roughed out ("Presenting Christ to the unchurched in relevant, innovative and life-changing ways"), has already assisted in planning concerning the strategic movement of our ministry over the next five years. And, the strategies and actions steps that are being developed to that end should move us in that direction. And, when I look at the process, it just feels like good, clean fun, because, as with any strategic movement of this kind, a new Sigmoid Curve can get moving. And that's just good times . . . and a good horizon for our ministry. Thanks so much for your prayers in the process. Soli Deo Gloria.
