Believe it or not, there's an entire website devoted to confessing things. If you're struggling with something or have something on your mind, and you want to unload it publicly, evidently you can go to www.confessions.net and speak your peace. Do that today, and you'll find that you have company. To date, hundreds of people have taken advantage of this website to out personal data ranging anywhere from cheating on a boyfriend or girlfriend to expressing sorrow over hurting a beloved pet. Go there and you can read about the anguish of a kid who's keeping track of how long it's been since her parents said that they loved her. And, you can note the religious journey of at least one individual who has decided that his official religion isn't any of the popular ones. No, he's not coming out as Christian or Buddhist, Muslim or Scientologist. Nope, he's Selfish.

If you go to this website (or to any of the others geared in this direction) I think that somewhere in the midst of these confessions you'll realize that people often times share things online that they would never share face to face. The internet provides a kind of pseudo-anonymity that gives the sort of psychological comfort needed to unburden what we hold onto. While this has negative expressions (e.g. cyber-bullying, cyber affairs, sexting, etc.) this phenomenon has a positive side to it as well. The old cliché tells us, "confession is good for the soul." And beyond that stands the reality Walter Luthi points to when he says that the act of confession "in itself means help, it means being lifted out of inward loneliness, out of egocentricity, and out of a cramped state of mind" (Luthi, *Confession*, 60-61). There are burdens we carry, earned or otherwise, that confession lifts and that we *need* confession to lift. And now, because of the comfort and pseudo-anonymity provided by the internet, more people are taking advantage of this fact than ever before.

This October at Central, we're going to track with this social phenomenon and let it guide us into some productive territory. We're devoting an entire sermon series to the idea of responding to the sort of burdens and concerns we'd only share online (e.g. "I don't know what to say"; "I feel inadequate"; "I'm struggling"; "I'm scared of dying"). And as we riff off the internet in this direction, responding to these #Confessions, our prayer is that we would increasingly have God's response to the needs highlighted by this social phenomenon. Galatians 6:2 tells us to "carry each others burdens." This October, let's increase in our ability to do that.

Be bold. Stay faithful.

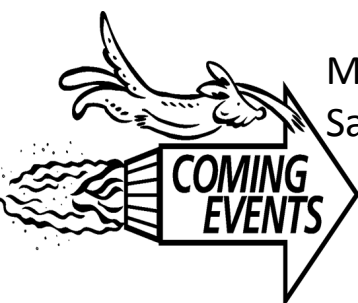

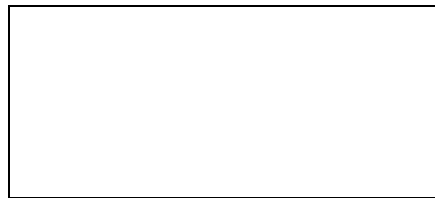
