Several years ago, I heard a song on WBGL, and it really spoke to me during that season of life. I would listen to it whenever I drove or walked in solitude or returned home late after working overtime for the umpteenth time. It goes:

When I am down and, oh my soul, so weary When troubles come and my heart burdened be Then, I am still and wait here in the silence Until you come and sit awhile with me You raise me up

Growing weary seems to be a natural result of dealing with circumstances and experiences, none of them bad but most of them just plain exhausting. For example:

We can be weary of waiting (Psalm 69:3). We can be weary of fighting the enemy (2 Samuel 23:10). We can be weary of criticism (Psalm 6:6-7).

The longer we are weary, the more our hope, our motivation, our spark, our optimism is strangled. Our life seems sapped as we run the race without being able to catch our breath.

If you are weary this winter I want to give you a word of encouragement from the prophet Isaiah: "The Sovereign LORD has given me his words of wisdom, so that I know how to comfort the weary. Morning by morning he wakens me and opens my understanding to his will" (Isaiah 50:4).

Our God never grows weary and he never gets tired. God can give strength to the weary — He really can! The Lord doesn't promise to give us an anti-weary pill or something to take so we can tough it through our weary moments. Instead, God promises us Himself morning by morning every single day. That is all. That is enough to Raise You Up.

Here's what you need to know...

We will begin meeting at the **9:30 a.m. hour on Sunday, February 7.** Student services will be added at the 11:00 a.m. service soon! Students in grades **6th through 12th Grade** will meet in the gym.

Students can enter the main entrance with their parents and check-in at the beginning of the West hallway. Volunteers will be available for check-in and to assist with drop-off and pick-up.

A parent MUST be registered and present at Central during the same worship hour in order for students under 16 to attend. Students who are 16 or older and can drive themselves may attend without a parent. Students who plan to drive themselves can reserve their spot by signing up each week or contacting Paul.

The Who, Not the What

Calvin M. Johansson says in his book *Music and Ministry: A Biblical Counterpoint*:

Christians face the prospect that through their actions (including their music) God is made known. Church music is testimony, and in worship believers use cultural expressions, such as music, to show what God has done, what He means, and who He is.

When I read that passage I was reminded that worship is for God: to show what He has done, what He means, and who He is. Often, we are tempted to make worship something that we do, something that's for us. We put a box around that style, that song, that way and say anything outside of it is not worship — at least not worship for us.

I've learned over the years that personal preference should always take a backseat to biblical truth. The words we are singing to God are always more important than the way we sing them. It's the who, not the what, that makes what we do in worship important.

This is not an easy concept to take to heart and even harder to put into practice. I'm not perfect with this and doubt I ever will be. But my prayer is that, as I grow, I can continually focus on the who and not the what.
